Baoyan CHENG is Associate Professor of Education. Her research focuses on international student mobility; she is the author of (Springer, 2020), "Cultivating Citizens with Confucian Cosmopolitanism" (, 2020), and "Chinese Students Studying in American High Schools" (, 2019)



Dongping ZHENG is Associate Professor of Second Language Studies. She focuses on three lines of research: 1) language development in game-based virtual environments, 2) rethinking second language acquisition and learning from ecological, dialogical and distributed perspectives, and 3) developing new methodology for embodied and non-local events of languaging.



Song JIANG is Associate Professor and Chinese section head in the Department of East Asian Languages & Literature. His research focuses on lexical semantics, cognitive linguistics, teaching pedagogy, and technology for teaching and learning. He is the author of (Routledge, 2017).
